





## 2025 Annual meeting



- Where & When? Online, 13-14 May 2025
- What? Reviewed situation of mosquito-borne diseases in PICs and country experiences with vector surveillance and control & outlined PacMOSSI progress and support.
- Outputs? Presentations, session videos, meeting report



## Online course



- > 600 enrollees (>350 from the Pacific)
- Evaluation with 146 respondents provided generally very positive feedback and helpful suggestions
  - Expand and diversify course content
  - Create supplementary reading materials
  - Integrate synchronous learning opportunities
  - Improve Statements of completion
  - Improve accessibility and learner support
  - Strengthen collaborations with universities and regional health bodies to integrate content
  - Monitor and communicate the impact of the training
- 2 new modules & guides under development
  - Vector control program & activity management
  - Operational vector control

## Mentoring program



- Phase 1 launched October 2024
  - 5 mentees selected and coupled with 5 mentors
  - Monthly thematic activities over 12 months
  - Quarterly focus meetings, including on topics such as GEDSI
- New round to commence in 2026

- Kiribati, Samoa, Niue, Tonga, Nauru

- Identification key for adult Aedes in the Pacific
- Evaluation of Aedes sampling methods in 6 PICs
- Other guidance under development
